Where Australia is doing well:



• High participation in early childhood education (ECEC) with **90% of four-year-olds** enrolled.



• Development of a comprehensive Early Years Strategy.



• **Above-average performance** in international assessments (PISA).



• Strong reading habits in children aged 5-14, with **72%** reading for pleasure.



• High attainment rates in Year 12, vocational, and tertiary education.

Where Australia is lagging:



 Unequal ECEC access for disadvantaged and remote communities.



• Severe workforce shortages in ECEC services.



• One in three students not proficient in literacy or numeracy (NAPLAN 2024).



• **Declining school attendance** rates (down to 89% for Years 1-10)



• **High stress among teenagers.** School stress is the top concern for 15-19-year-olds



Top 3 challenges

- 1. Cost-of-Living Crisis: 761,000 children below the poverty line.
- 2. **Climate Change:** Disruptions from natural disasters affecting education and wellbeing.
- 3. **Digital Divide:** 50% of low-income families lack digital devices.

Top 5 areas for action

- 1. **Holistic Education Reform:** Align with Reinventing Australian Schools principles.
- 2. **Tackle Inequality:** Ensure all children, especially in disadvantaged communities, access quality education.
- 3. **Support Wellbeing:** Strengthen connections between schools, health services, and communities.
- 4. Address Cost-of-Living Impact: Provide targeted support to low-income families.
- 5. Improve Early Childhood Education Access: Build universal access to quality early education.
